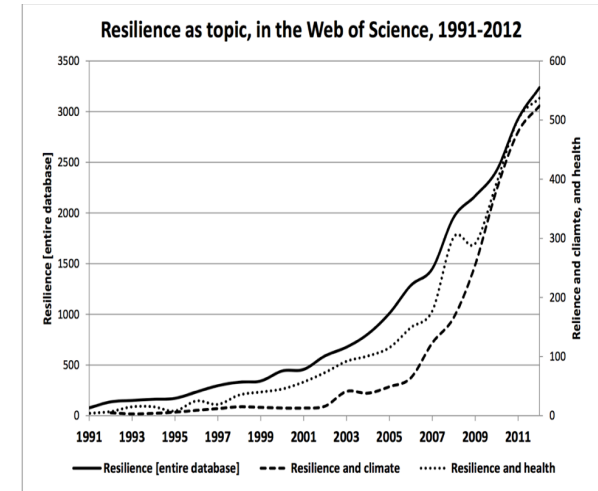

Mainly theoretical developments

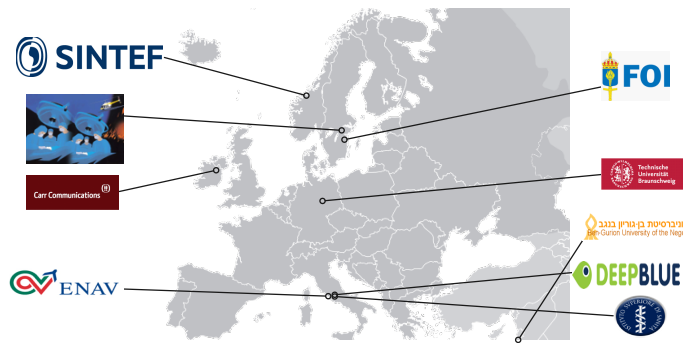
DARWIN – Expect the unexpected and know how to respond

- 6 European countries

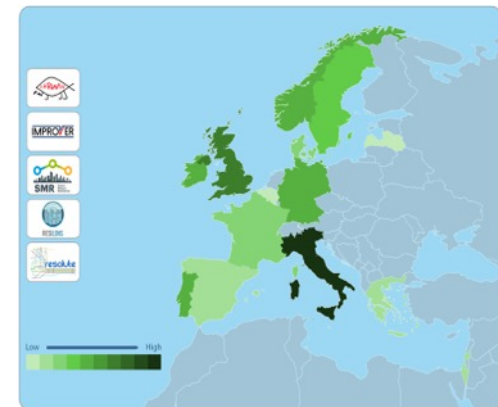


DARWIN Community of Practitioners (DCoP - 2016)

Project Objectives

Main objective and core result

The development of evolving European resilience guidelines

Sub-objectives:

O1. Guidelines available in a form that makes it easy for a particular infrastructure operator to apply them in practice

O2. Enable use of resilience guidelines in non-crisis situations

O3. Facilitate evolution of resilience guidelines

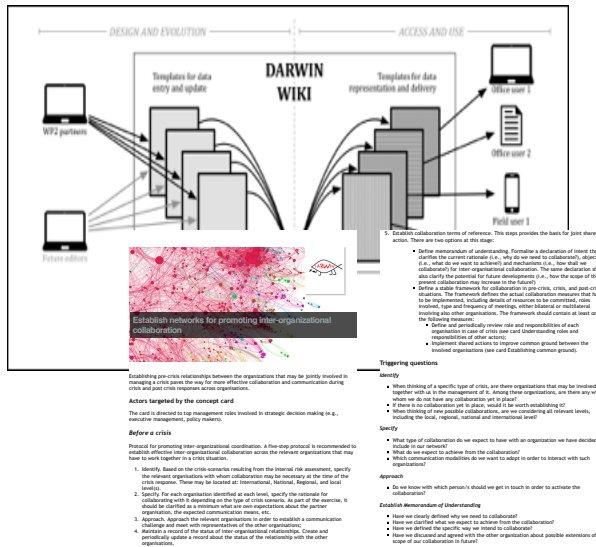


Project Objectives

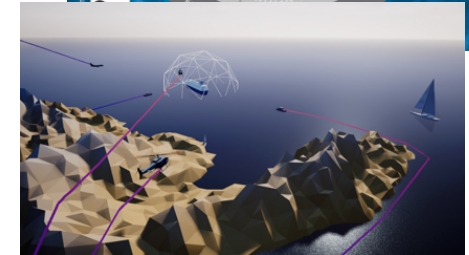
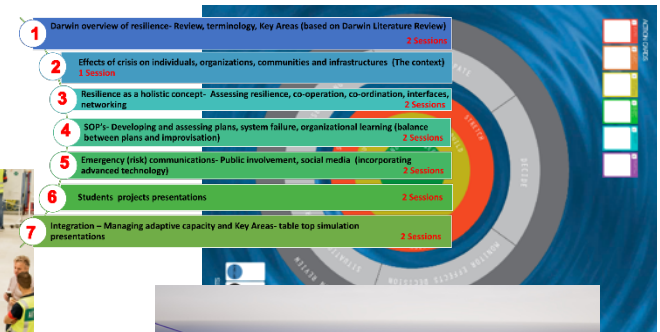
- O4. Establish a forum - the Community of Resilience and Crisis Practitioners - with a lifetime that will extend beyond the end of the project
- O5. To build on “lessons learned” in the area of resilience of what works well and what does not
- O6. Carry out two pilots that apply project results in two key areas - Health care and Air Traffic Management (ATM)
- O7. Establish activities that will lead to project results being adapted to, and later adopted by, practitioners in domains other than the two used in the pilots

 - ISO Guide 73:2009. Risk management – Vocabulary.
 - ISO 22300 (2012). Societal security – Terminology.
 - ISO 22320 (2011): Societal security – Emergency management – Requirements for incident response.
- Participation on standards (e.g. SINTEF/NTNU) - CEN/TC 391 WG3 – Crisis Management and Civil Protection
The WG is preparing a Technical Standard expected June 2017 Crisis Management – Guidance for developing a strategic capability
- On-going : Common DRS-7 White paper
